Puppy mill operators buy and sell “breeder” dogs at auctions. These are not treated as pets — valued strictly for their capacity to make money. They are kept in cages for their entire breeding lives, usually living in outbuildings in wire cages instead of homes. They never run in the grass, sleep in a bed, or play with a toy. Instead, they are “fed and bred,” eating and relieving themselves in the same 2-by-2-foot cage until their breeding days are done. Rarely, if ever, will they ever even step foot on grass.



The time has come to say “No More!” to dog auctions in Ohio. We want to give Ohio voters the chance to speak out on this issue and make it clear that this is no longer acceptable in our State. Please join us to help put this on Ohio’s ballot.
